A SNAPSHOT OF LVGA HISTORY

1999-2005: A small group of residents learned that the 6-acre tract of land was being proposed as a future site for a commercial property. Over the next 6 years, the all-volunteer group grew its membership, raised money, and worked closely with county and township decision-makers to get The Village Green built. It officially opened in 2005.

2001: LVGA became Incorporated.

2003-2007: LVGA learned that the county was proposing widening Newman Springs Rd. Knowing this would affect our quality of life, the LVGA suggested an alternative solution - a round-about. In 2006 the plan was approved and the round-about was completed in 2007.

2009: LVGA first to "Adopt-A-Spot"; planted and continues to maintain a small garden on the median on Route 520.

2009: First Candidates' Night held at Lincroft School.

2011: LVGA urges county to add a Pedestrian Bridge at Thompson Park. This section, across from CBA, was the last part needed to finish the five-mile loop at the park.

2008-2014: The LVGA supported residents throughout Lincroft who were concerned with over-development and land-use issues affecting the village character and quality of life.

2017-Present: Beautification Project at The Village Green begins with well and sprinkler installation.

2000-2020: The LVGA has sponsored many community events such as Picnic in the Park concerts, Movie Night, Candidates Night, Egg Hunt, Yard Sale Day, Jack-o-Lantern Jubilee, Food Truck Festival & Car Show.
