2025 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 1 TWO WAY ACME ROAD
 - We have advocated for 25 years for the construction of a two-way Acme Road connecting Middletown-Lincroft Road with the Acme property; with roadway sidewalks, crosswalks, and the resulting closure or redesign of driveways on 520. Middletown negotiated the land purchase, allowing the project to move forward. This County funded project has been approved and designed, and it will be built in 2025.
- PHALANX ROAD ROUNDABOUT
 Since 2017 we have advocated for the construction of a roundabout at the Phalanx
 Road entrance to Brookdale Community College. At our urging, the project will
 include sidewalks and lighted beacon crosswalks on Campus Drive for the High Tech
 High students to access the athletic fields. This County funded project has been
 approved and designed, and it will be built in the spring of 2025.
- **3.** CAMPUS DRIVE CROSSWALK

 We are partnering with Brookdale Community College to improve connectivity between the college and the community with a mid-block crosswalk across Campus Drive between the Lincroft Little League fields and Parking Lot 3. This project is in the design stage.
- We are collaborating with County Traffic Engineers, Middletown Engineering, and the Middletown Police, as we focus on enhancing safety initiatives throughout Lincroft, particularly along the 520 Corridor. We are analyzing accident reports and speedbox data to understand the recent increase in accidents throughout Lincroft, particularly at the Navy Road overpass and at GSP Exit 109. We are advocating for improved traffic signals and signs, better lighting, safer traffic circulation, and traffic calming measures such as a road diet to reduce 520 to two lanes with bike lanes and turning islands with pedestrian refuges and a mid-block crosswalk.
- We will continue to advocate for Middletown to adopt a Complete Streets Policy safe access for all people who need to use the road, including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists, and transit riders of all ages and abilities. We will be researching locations where a pedestrian and bike trail, portions of which already exist, can be constructed to better connect town assets and parks. Complete Streets and Trails were also recommended by Middletown's 2024 Master Plan consultant, BFJ Planning.
